Sub: Extention of AICTE approval to the existing Kongu Engineering College, Perundurai, Tamil Nadu.

Sir,

I am directed to state that on the basis of the recommendations of the Southern Regional Committee of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the AICTE has accorded extention of approval to the Kongu Engineering College, Perundurai, Tamil Nadu for conduct of the following four existing 4- year Degree courses with the annual intakes indicated against each for the academic year 1993-94 only:-

Civil Engineering	30 (Thirty)
Mechanical Engineering	60 (Sixty)
Electronics & Communication Engineering	60 (Sixty)
Computer Science & Engineering	30 (Thirty)

This approval is subject to fulfilment of the following conditions:-

- 1) The condition stipulated in this Council's letter of even no. dated 29th April, 1993 will remain unchanged.
- ✓ 2) AICTE pay scales should be paid to all the teaching faculty with immediate effect.
- ✓ 3) The Management of the College including the Governing Council should be constituted as per the guidelines of the AICTE.
- 4) The annual recurring expenditure per student should be brought up to the level of Rs.11,916/-.
- ✓ 5) All admissions should be made as per the norms and guidelines of the AICTE as adopted by the State of Tamil Nadu.
- ✓ 6) The tuition and other fees should be charged as prescribed by the State Government within the overall criteria prescribed by the AICTE from time to time. No capitation fees should be charged from the students/ guardians of the students in any form.

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- 7) The accounts of the Institute should be audited by a Chartered Accountant and should be open for inspection by the AICTE or anybody authorised by it.
- 8) The teaching and other staff should be recruited according to the procedure, guidelines and experience prescribed by the AICTE.
- 9) No new course should be started without the prior approval of the AICTE.
- 10) The intake in any of the approved courses should not be altered under any circumstances without the prior concurrence of the AICTE.

This approval is subject to full compliance with the SCHEME as prescribed by the Supreme Court of India in its Judgment dated 4-2-1993 on Writ Petition (C) No. 607 of 1992 with other WPs in the case of Unnikrishnan, J P. and others etc. etc. vs State of Andhra Pradesh and others etc. etc. and the related guidelines and criteria as may be issued by the AICTE, UGC or the Central Government from time to time.

The Management should strictly follow any further conditions as may be laid down by the AICTE from time to time.

In the event of non-compliance by the Trust or the Institute with the above conditions of the AICTE, the AICTE will be free to take measures for withdrawal of its approval without consideration of any related issues and that all the consequent liabilities would be that of the Trust and/or the Institute.

An Expert Committee of the AICTE will visit the College by the end of the academic year 1993-94 to review the progress made in fulfilling the conditions laid down by the AICTE and recommend continuation of the AICTE approval or otherwise.

You are requested to kindly take appropriate action to implement the decision of the AICTE and communicate the progress made in this regard to the Southern Regional Office of the AICTE under intimation to this Office.
